### **SPC to host Go For It! Seminar on April 7**

REESE CENTER – South Plains College Reese Center presents **Go For It!** a **free** seminar providing step-by-step planning for college, now in its' 16<sup>th</sup> year! **Go For It!** will be held from 6 to 8 p.m. April 7<sup>th</sup> in Room 101 of the Byron Martin Advanced Technology Center, 3201 Ave. Q.

The **Go For It!** seminar targets potential technical students who might not be aware of the support and financial assistance currently available for college. Single parents, displaced homemakers and others with perceived barriers to college attendance are encouraged to attend.

The primary focus is to share information about resources for individuals in need of answers to questions about financial aid, assistance with child care while attending school, funding for transportation to and from school, paying for textbooks and numerous other areas of concern. The agenda includes brief presentations by local agency representatives as well as agency displays featuring resource materials on all topics related to obtaining a technical education. Additionally, there will be ample opportunity for participants to speak individually to individuals who work daily with students.

Counselors, Academic Advisors, Financial Aid and Testing Experts, Instructors and Technical Program Coordinators from South Plains College will be on hand as well as representatives from LEARN, Inc., Catholic Family Service, WorkForce Solutions Career Center and Child Care Services, Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services, Dorothy Lomax Adult Education Center and many other community agency partners. A panel comprised of current and former students who will share their own college experiences.

The public is invited to attend and encouraged to ask questions about what it takes to be a successful college student! Spanish interpreters will be on hand.
