What is it?

Upward Bound is a college preparatory program funded by the U.S. Department of Education.

It provides young students with the skills they need to be successful in college. Participants receive academic, personal, and cultural enrichment to prepare them for higher education.

How does it work?

The Upward Bound program has three main components: after-school tutoring, Saturday Academies and the Summer Residential Program.

- After-school tutoring targets the academic aspect by providing individualized, remedial or enrichment opportunities.
- Saturday Academies allot additional time for further academic support as well as culturally enriching activities.



Improve your grades and test scores through group and individual tutoring. We offer tutoring in all core subjects as well as specialized tutoring for the TAKS test.

Who can apply?

Students enrolled in the ninth through eleventh grades that will be first generation college graduates and/or meet low-income criteria are eligible for the program.

For family units with more than 8 members, add the following amount for each additional family member: \$5,100 for the 48 contiguous states, the District of Columbia and outlying jurisdictions; \$6,375 for Alaska; and \$5,865 for Hawaii.

The term "low-income individual" means an individual whose family's taxable income for the preceding year did not exceed 150 percent of the poverty level amount.

The figures shown under family income represent amounts equal to 150 percent of the family income levels established by the Census Bureau for determining poverty status. The poverty guidelines were published by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services in the [Federal Register](#), Vol. 71, No. 15, January 24, 2006, pp. 3848-3849.
