General Information

Textbook: The textbook we will use "Shut Up and Shoot". You can buy an Adobe CC book if you would like to learn more on your own. I will have additional handouts and notes in class. Keep up with the handouts and notes because some of the information for the exams will come from and will help you when working on projects. You will also be assigned some videos to watch on YouTube and other sites.

Attendance Policy: The attendance policy in this class will be enforced. Students will begin the semester with 100 points for the semester for attendance. After 2 absences (excused or non-excused) from the class 5 points will be deducted from the 100points for each absence thereafter. After the 5th absence a student cannot pass this class.

Grade Determination: The student's grade will be determined on the basis of their performance in class. It will include class attendance, in-class participation, quizzes, exams, and projects. Each activity will be weighted as follows:

There is some outside of class time commitment for this class especially after the first couple of weeks. So the excuse "I do not have time to work on the project" will not be accepted.

Purpose of the course: This course is a continuation of Video Production I. The student will build on what they learned in VP I and learn more about post-production especially using the Adobe CC. This course will provide students with a general knowledge of the fundamentals of television production and the process of operating television and video equipment. Students will learn the process of planning for a television or video production. They will learn the pre-production, production, and post-production stages of videoing an event. The student will gain knowledge in operating field cameras, studio cameras, video machines, non-linear editing, basic lighting, audio for video, and computer-generated graphics. The student will understand how to tell a story visually.

Course objective: Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to demonstrate a working knowledge of the equipment used for video production in a studio or out in the field. The student will also have knowledge of the terminology used in the television and video industry, and the process of producing quality video productions.

In this class you will learn the following:

- 1. A. Video/Television Studio equipment
 - B. Terms used in studio setting
 - C. Studio cameras, studio audio, microphones, video switcher, etc.
 - D. Work on various studio sets used in video
 - E. We will air 3 live programs this semester
- 2. A. Learn to use field (single camera) production
 - B. Mobile lighting
 - C. Field audio recording
 - D. Post production

3. Pre and Post Production

- A. Preparing for a video production, script, audience, equipment
- B. Posting and editing a video, graphics, and music
- C. How will people see the video, online, DVD, etc.
