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## **Course Description:**

This course examines the visual arts, including painting, sculpture, printmaking, photography, and architecture, from prehistory to the present. While emphasis is placed on the arts of Europe and the United States, those of Latin America, Africa, and Asia are also discussed.

## Learning Outcomes for Art History:

- 1. Employ the vocabulary and concepts used to discuss works of art, artists, and art history.
- 2. Identify the visual hallmarks of regional and period styles for formal, technical, and expressive qualities.
- 3. Interpret the meaning of works of art from diverse cultures, periods, and locations based on their themes, subjects, and symbols.
- 4. Relate artists and works of art to their cultural, economic, and political contexts.
- 5. Interpret art using appropriate art historical methods, such as observation and inductive reasoning.
- 6. Select visual and textual evidence to support an argument or interpretation.

## **Required Course Material:**

Grievance and Conflict Resolution: The Office of the Vice President of Student Affairs is available to assist students with any conflict or problem that has to do with being a student at South Plains College. A suggested protocol usually includes talking with the professor first, then visiting with the department chair, and finally approaching the Student Affairs Office. If you feel uncomfortable with the first two steps, you may approach the Student Affairs Office immediately.
